### American Federation of Astrologers Professional Exam Guidelines

The American Federation Astrologers continues to emphasize excellence in astrology and astrological practice and methods by certifying astrologers who pass its rigorous exams. These exams were established to set a high standard in astrology, and that tradition continues today.

Note: A passing grade on the AFA Student Exam is a prerequisite for taking the Professional Exam.

Candidates who successfully demonstrate their knowledge on the Professional Exam are among the most qualified astrologers in the world. Thus, the bar is high for this exam, and requires extensive astrological knowledge and experience.

Specifically, the Professional Exam requires knowledge and expertise in the following:

- Calculation of the natal chart, including declinations, planetary positions, and house cusps.
- Calculation of the secondary progressed chart, including declination, planetary positions, Midheaven and Ascendant.
- Calculation and interpretation of midpoints.
- Interpretation of natal, secondary progressed and transit charts.
- Interpretation of major fixed stars.
- Derivative houses.
- Calculation and interpretation of the solar return chart.
- Interpretation of an horary chart.
- Rectification of the birth chart.
- Interpretation of the diurnal chart.
- Uranian astrology.
- Interpretation of the composite chart.
- The prenatal epoch.
- Interpretation of the mundane chart.
